 - Acknowledgment of Indigenous Land
 - Increase inclusivity on campus, empower those who wish to be an ally, create a visible network of support, promote diversity, advocate for equitable change
 - What is a safe space?
 - o Carolyn: safe space is positive, welcoming
 - Anastasia: does promote discussion, given opportunity to speak, may censor people's opinion
 - o definition from David: space where you do not feel scared or oppressed to speak your mind and room for clarification
 - Allyship:
 - What is Allyship
 - Carolyn: support resource
 - Nico: promoting inclusive behaviour
 - Trevor: extends to everyone
 - o Culture Redefine: Western Culture, SSSC role
 - Intersectionality
 - Mitchell: intermixing of different race, genders and what we classify society as
 - Zach: different parts of our identity that make up how we interact
 - David: language, culture, class, age, race, gender, ethnicity, education, sexuality, ability

- o 3 examples:
 - Female, single mother, African American, University education, Catholic
 - Chris: university education as a privilege
 - Sexism and racism possible oppressions
 - Male, HIV positive, Upper-Middle Class, Employed Full Time, Married
 - ➤ Austin: full time job, upper-middle class
 - > Oppression: HIV positive
 - Female, only-child, lower-middle class, learning disability, Immigrant
- Oppression (not discussed)
- Questions:
 - Owen: Events on campus? Ally Western and Ally Ivey both do presentations, creating presentation on topics, problem is lack of knowledge
 - Robert: Comparison of people, topic of discussion, not necessary to identify gender (used as example)
 - David: identifies himself as Gay to avoid discussion during presentation and sharing his story
 - David: female/male, understanding that our society is built on a structure of oppression, lets not generalize but remember that institutionalized oppression exists
 - o oppression based more on class or gender? David: individual thought welcomed, his perspective: depends on the individual, David requests filling out the Ally survey
